




STATISTICS AND DEMOGRAPHICS 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

- Physical: 97% meeting or exceeding expectations.
 - Language: 81% meeting or exceeding expectations
 - Cognitive: 78% meeting or exceeding expectations
- Literacy: 78% meeting or exceeding expectations.
